It is with great joy that I welcome you to RENEW International's 11th Annual Gala.



President's Award

Dr. Patricia M. Dinneen

Patricia Dinneen was instrumental in organizing the first annual Archdiocesan Justice Convocation in Boston in October 2009. While planned for as part of *ARISE* from the beginning, the Convocation's success was due in large part to the collaborative efforts between the Archdiocesan Pastoral Council (APC) of which Pat is a member, Catholic Relief Services, and the Archdiocesan and RENEW *ARISE* Teams. The Convocation was timed to coincide with Season 3 of *ARISE, In the Footsteps of Christ*, which focused on Catholic Social Teaching.

Pat has always had a passion for social justice, starting with Civil Rights activities in high school, tutoring in the inner cities during college, volunteering in homeless shelters both domestically and internationally, and using her sabbatical to work at a homeless shelter in Boston.

Her career in emerging markets has been motivated by a desire to reduce world poverty and redistribute wealth. When she was appointed by her pastor at St. Peter in Cambridge, Massachusetts to serve on the APC of Boston, she established a Social Justice Committee to promote understanding of Catholic Social Teaching and to take action on high priority issues.

Pat holds a B.A. in Economics and Russian Studies from the University of Pennsylvania, an M.Sc. in Soviet Economics from the London School of Economics, and a Ph.D. in Economics from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.



Both Pat and her husband, Dr. John Mooney, are active in their parish, St. Peter in Cambridge, where Pat is a lector, Eucharistic minister, and Chair of the Social Justice Committee.

As a follow up to the Convocation, Pat is working to implement Cardinal O'Malley's dream of a Social Justice Committee in every parish of the Archdiocese.



President's Award

Mrs. Mary Ann McLaughlin

Mary Ann McLaughlin coordinates all aspects of *ARISE Together in Christ* in the Archdiocese of Boston. She is the Co-Director of the Archdiocesan Office of Worship and Spiritual Life and former Lay Director of the Archdiocesan Cursillo Movement.

Mary Ann has been critical to the success of *ARISE* in the Archdiocese, displaying an incredible energy level by attending every workshop; giving parish presentations; and creating and hosting CatholicTV's *ARISE* faith-sharing program during Season Two (and will be doing it again for Season 5). She promoted and encouraged bringing *ARISE* to prisons and nursing homes, and even leads an *ARISE* small community comprised of mothers of religious education students at her home parish.

Mary Ann lives in Brighton, Massachusetts, and is a wife and mother of six grown children, and grandmother to eleven. She graduated from Boston College School of Education and received her Master's degree in Christian Spirituality from Creighton University in Omaha Nebraska. She is a former teacher and is presently a member of Our Lady Help of Christians Parish in Newton, Massachusetts.

Together with Reverend John Sassani she co-authored *Living With Christ* which has recently been published by Loyola Press and is now titled *Meeting Christ in Prayer*. Mary Ann is also a contributing author to *Bereaved Children and Teens*, edited by Earl Grollman.



President's Award

Mr. John A. McNeice, Jr.

John A. McNeice, Jr. was raised in Quincy, Massachusetts in a family "too poor to purchase a car." He credits his parents' faith and his Jesuit education with instilling in him a moral foundation and a commitment to volunteerism and community service.

In 2007 Cardinal Seán O'Malley invited John to Chair the Lay Advisory Committee responsible for promoting and supporting the implementation of RENEW in the Archdiocese of Boston. John's financial and moral support has contributed greatly to the success of *ARISE*. His incredible generosity and commitment to the spiritual renewal of the Church of Boston led to his support of the Archdiocese of Boston *ARISE* office including scholarships for financially needy parishes; promotion and advertising; and day-to-day administrative expenses.

John is the retired chairman and chief executive officer of The Colonial Group, Inc., one of the most successful mutual fund management firms in the country. Very active in the Archdiocese of Boston, he serves on the Catholic Schools Foundation's Inner-City Scholarship Fund Executive Council; Archdiocesan Finance Council and Stewardship Committee; and is a past-president of Catholic Charities.

He has also been a trustee of Boston College's Development Board, Boston College High School, and Nativity Preparatory School. In addition, he has served on the boards of the American Ireland Fund, the Peter F. Drucker Foundation for Nonprofit Management, and the Pope John XXIII Medical Moral Research and Education Center.



In 1994, John was awarded the William V. McKenney Award by the Boston College Alumni Association and was also awarded an honorary Doctor of Business Administration degree.

John and his wife Margarete, who met during his military service in Austria, have been married for over 50 years and continue to support many Catholic organizations and institutions in the Greater Boston area and beyond.

President's Award

Reverend William G. Williams

Fr. William (Bill) Williams has been instrumental to the success of *ARISE* in Boston. Over his many years in parish life, he has been involved in several successful parish renewal programs, including the earlier *RENEW for the 21st Century* effort in the Archdiocese of Boston.

Fr. Bill's gift is building vibrant, welcoming parish communities, and he knew that at this difficult time for the Church in Boston, something was needed to unite and grow the faith life of his parish.

When Fr. Bill heard that *RENEW* International was returning to the Archdiocese with *ARISE Together in Christ*, a diocesan-wide, parish-based faith enrichment program, he knew he had found what he was looking for. He gave *ARISE* his full support and energy, attending the initial gathering of priests to speak on the positive impact the *RENEW* process had made on his parish.

The success of *ARISE* at St. Mary's Parish in Dedham is due in large part to Fr. Bill's selection of outstanding lay leadership and his personal encouragement to them and to the entire parish.

Fr. Bill was born and raised in Boston. Knowing that the ministry was his calling, he entered the seminary after high school. Fr. Bill has been a Boston priest for 40 years. In that time he has served in six parishes – one for 13 years and another for 14 years. He served at St. Mary's for the past three years and has recently moved to St. Peter's Parish in Plymouth, MA.

ARISE Together in Christ

ARISE Together in Christ was developed in response to the particular need for healing and spiritual renewal in the Archdiocese of Boston, but it also addresses universal pastoral needs across the country. Certainly, this large, prominent archdiocese has had to deal with intense challenges in the wake of its high-profile abuse crisis and difficult parish closings. Yet, in many ways, the Church in Boston is a microcosm of the Church in the United States. Immigrants speaking Spanish, Portuguese, Haitian Creole, Vietnamese, and more, flock to neighborhood parishes. Parents look for ways to strengthen family faith in the midst of today's secular culture. Young adults search for life's meaning, but not always in the parish. *ARISE Together in Christ* offers training and resources to address each of these pastoral needs.

In these past two years in Boston, *ARISE Together in Christ* has involved over 180 parishes and 30,000 individuals, ushering in a new dawn as small communities come together to share faith and hope for themselves and the life of their parishes.

As the phrase "Together in Christ" suggests, *ARISE* built bridges between merged parishes, connected diverse ethnic communities, and forged deeper relationships among parish members, young and old. *ARISE* responded to Cardinal Seán

O'Malley's desire to reach out to the different facets of Archdiocesan life—the Pastoral Center, prisons, nursing homes, schools, and campuses. It also brought together the Archdiocesan offices and ministries of Boston in new and productive ways for collaboration.

ARISE Together in Christ **Faith-Sharing Reflection**

One gesture of forgiveness explored during Season Four is about the Amish people and what happened to their community in the fall of 2006. The extraordinary act of forgiveness by the community for the deaths of five of their children was viewed as such by the world over. It was transforming. What enabled the Amish parents to offer forgiveness so quickly?

Part of it is surely taking very seriously the advice that comes at the beginning of today's Scripture reading, expressed very personally by Paul ("imitate me"). It may help to understand the force of his words if we recognize this as faith-sharing from prison, where Paul finds himself for preaching a Christ who died and who is raised.

We might imagine Paul, in prison, praying to encourage himself, affirming in his own moment of suffering the central great belief in the transforming power of the cross: Christ,



though innocent, accepts the tragedy that the cross brings, and in so doing, converts it into the instrument of our forgiveness.

We may regard some of the Amish customs as too literal, but what is surely worthy of imitation is how they look to the model of Christ, who carries his cross without complaint, and whose dying words are “Father, forgive them, they know not what they do.” The model of Christ who taught us how to pray the Lord’s Prayer, with the intercession “Forgive us, as we forgive...”

Millions of other Christians take these words on their lips, and yet how many of us must admit that we may not have responded with such instinctive forgiveness as did the Amish. Their secret is a willingness to let their lives, down to their reactions, be shaped by the gospel. What is remarkable is that their Christian faith has trained them not to let that pain, loss and grief gets in the way of expressing forgiveness.

Today’s Scripture invites us to think of what happens to the physical body of Christ – humiliation transformed into glory – also happening to the body of Christ, the community of all those baptized. Yes, in Baptism we make our own the story of the cross, the story of dying to relive, the story of humiliation being transformed into glory. The fullness of that glory yet awaits us. Meantime, every act of Christ-like forgiveness is a sacrament, a making real of the transforming power we celebrate at Easter – but a

transforming power we are called to make real in our lives so that it is also real for others.

Sharing Our Faith

- ♦ What do I think is the spiritual source of the forgiveness the Amish were able to offer so spontaneously?
- ♦ Toward whom do I need to make a clear gesture of forgiveness? How will I do this?

Closing Reflection and Prayer

Donald Kraybill, co-author of *Amish Grace: How Forgiveness Transcended Tragedy* writes: “I think the most powerful demonstration of the depth of Amish forgiveness was when members of the Amish community went to the killer’s burial service at the cemetery. Several families, Amish families who had buried their own daughters just the day before were in attendance and they hugged the widow, and hugged other members of the killer’s family.”

Close by praying together:

God and Father of us all, you have forgiven our sins.
You give us your peace.
Help us to forgive each other and to work together to bring peace to the world. Amen.

RENEW International is a Catholic not-for-profit organization that has a 30-year history in revitalizing parish life by effectively implementing spiritual renewal and faith formation efforts in dioceses and parishes.

The mission of RENEW International is achieved through:

Why Catholic?/¿Por qué ser católico?

A practical, pastoral approach to help adults form their Catholic faith and to connect its teachings to their everyday lives. Participants experience a guided tour through Sacred Scripture and the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, allowing them to grow in understanding their faith and giving them the confidence to share it with others.

ARISE Together in Christ

A three-year, parish-centered process of spiritual renewal and evangelization designed for the laity and clergy of the Archdiocese of Boston. The process welcomes back those who have been distanced from the Church and enables them to deepen their faith, develop a closer relationship with Christ, grow in community, and reach out in service to others.

Young Adult Ministry (Parishes and college campuses)

An outreach that invites young adults into the life of the Church. Campus RENEW and Theology on Tap connect with young people in the places, and with the messages, that meet them where they are, whether on a college campus or at a casual social setting.

Longing for the Holy: Spirituality for Everyday Life

A 12-week spiritual process for those who want to enrich their sense of the presence of God. It concerns the way we channel the deep longing at the core of our beings and explores the implications of the central mysteries of Catholic faith—the Trinity, the Incarnation, the Eucharist, and the Paschal Mystery—for spirituality.



RENEW Africa

A commitment to sowing the seeds of peace is central to RENEW's mission, leading us across the continent. RENEW goes where many would not, to serve those who are suffering from oppression, war, and chaos.

RENEW Latin America

Ministries adapted to the culture and spiritual needs of small Christian communities in Central America, South America, and the Spanish-speaking countries of the Caribbean.
